Collect.

Loving God, who chose the blessed virgin Mary to be the mother of your incarnate Son: grant that we, who are redeemed by his blood, may share with her in the glory of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

FIRST READING: (Isaiah 61:10–62:3)

A reading from the book of Isaiah:

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the LORD God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations. For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD,

and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

THE SONG OF MARY (Luke 1:46–55)

'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

Who has looked with favour on his lowly servant. from this day all generations will call me blessed;

The Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

God has mercy on those who fear him from generation to generation.

The Lord has shown strength with his arm; and scattered the proud in their conceit.

Casting down the mighty from their thrones, and lifting up the lowly;

God has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.

He has come to the aid of his servant Israel, to remember the promise of mercy,

The promise made to our forebears, to Abraham and his children for ever.'

SECOND READING:

(Galatians 4:4–7)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galatians.

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children.

And because you are children,

God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

Hail Mary, full of grace! Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
