John the Baptist by El Greco (1541–1614)

The service begins on p. 119 of **A Prayer Book for Australia**; seasonal material for Advent is to be found on p. 147

Opening Hymn: II vv. I, 2 & 3

At the end of the second verse, the second candle on the Advent wreath is lit. We then say:

At 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., once the clergy enter, we say:

Celebrant: Blessed are you, Sovereign Lord, just and true:

All: to you be praise and glory for ever!

Celebrant: Your prophet John the Baptist was witness to the truth,

your Son, revealed as a burning and shining light.

May we your servants rejoice in his light,

and so be led to witness to him

who is the Lord of your coming Kingdom,

Jesus our Saviour and King of the ages.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

At 10:00 a.m., we then sing the third verse.

#### **SENTENCE**

The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe the good news.

Mark 1:15

Following the opening prayer, we move to p. 120 of **APBA** for the Kyrie (said or sung).

This introduces the Confession and Absolution.

During Advent, instead of the Gloria, we say together:

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

#### **COLLECT**

God of all peoples, whose servant John came baptizing and calling for repentance: help us to hear his voice of judgement, that we may also rejoice in his word of promise, and be found pure and blameless in that glorious Day when Christ comes to rule the earth as Prince of Peace; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came among us in great humility: that, on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

FIRST READING Isaiah 65:17–25

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

A shoot shall come out from the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins.

the leopard shall lie down with the kid,
the calf and the lion and the fatling together,
and a little child shall lead them.

May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God

in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy.

As it is written,

'Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name';

and again he says,

'Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people'; and again,

'Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise him';

and again Isaiah says,

'The root of Jesse shall come, the one who rises to rule the Gentiles; in him the Gentiles shall hope.'

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey.

Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan,

and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism,

he said to them, 'You brood of vipers!

Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves,

"We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you,

God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.

Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees;

every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals.

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

His winnowing-fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor and will gather his wheat into the granary;

but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

#### The Melbourne Anglican Cultural Organisation (MACO)

MACO is an organisation to which tax deductable donations can be made to support the 'Cultural' activities and areas at St George's. Parishioners will know that we have a continuing account with MACO to support the work of the choir, and we established another one to facilitate donations for the Restoration of the stained glass windows, classified as "of great cultural significance, in their depiction of the gospel's spread 'From Nazareth to the Pacific'."

Owing to the breadth of definition associated with this second account, it is completely acceptable to use funds donated there for the restoration work of the walls in the North and South Transept: after all, if the walls supporting the windows fall down, the restoration of the windows will have served little purpose.

It was always envisaged that donations through MACO for restoration works would be the preferred option for parishioners, with the National Trust appeal (which has a better 'name') for the wider community. The chief reason for this is that MACO offers donors the same tax deduction status, but the 'cut' it takes to run the fund-raising is considerably below that taken by National Trust – more money goes directly to the church.

As discussed at last week's Annual Meeting, therefore, parishioners are warmly encouraged to donate to MACO to assist with the costs of restoration, if you have not already done so (or even if you have!). Such donations will be most warmly welcomed.

# Pledge Giving: An important message from Parish Council

St George's is reliant on the generous giving of all parishioners to ensure its ongoing financial viability. **The Parish is** entirely self-funded.

Figures for the month of October reveal the stark reality:

Total income: \$22,430 and Total expenses: \$35,244

This is a significant deficit of \$12,914.

You will note that since publishing these figures we have had a negative trend in each month.

This reinforces the need for the pledge request that the Parish Council is making.

Looking to the future the Parish has substantial repairs and maintenance to undertake on the church building to address damp issues.

It is also committed to taking on an Assistant Curate next year.

These will add extra costs to the Parish.

For this reason, Parish Council is requesting that all current pledge givers consider their current pledge undertakings and look to increase them in a substantive way. We also request that those who have not yet made an annual pledge and are contributing via the open plate to consider seriously committing to our annual pledge programme. (Offerings are then payable weekly/monthly/quarterly or annually in advance). These contributions are critical to the financial management of the Parish. We are forecasting total expenses for next year of **over \$800,000**. Whether you attend weekly or less often Parish expenses remain the same.

We are richly blessed by the foresight and generosity of many who preceded us here.

They have provided a beautiful church in which to worship every week, with gardens, grounds and other buildings.

We all enjoy a wonderful Parish with outstanding ministry led by the vicar, Father Gregory, and wonderful pastoral care and companionship.

Unfortunately we need to recognise that maintaining all of this costs money. Therefore please give this request serious consideration.
